The importance of group work has become something of a management orthodoxy in office environments in recent decades. 0.....K... An understanding of these issues is vital to ensuring successful collaboration and avoiding mere lip service.

The principal strength of collaborative work is that it allows both knowledge and experience to be shared among group members. 1..... Such demanding assignments would be far harder to accomplish on an individual basis.

In addition, co-operative work creates the conditions for more ideas to be generated. 2..... This is because they are denied the opportunity to bounce their thoughts off colleagues. Brainstorming alone is a bit of a non-starter.

Besides the greater number of ideas provided by collaborative techniques, group work also contributes to higher degrees of accuracy. 3..... When work is done collaboratively, on the other hand, there is a greater likelihood that errors will be picked up and put right by other group members. This is a crucial element in enhancing the quality of the final piece of work. It also encourages people to take risks rather than play it safe, as some form of safety net is provided.

Working in isolation can be a dispiriting experience for some of us even at the

best of times, especially for those who might be lacking in confidence. 4..... Without team members around you, you have to provide these crucial ingredients yourself.

Co-operative work is also a method for establishing new relationships and strengthening those that already exist. 5..... It's particularly useful in this regard in helping newer members settle in, especially if they have a different background or come from another culture.

Of course, no system is without its drawbacks, and group work is certainly no exception. For this reason, it's important not to accept it uncritically as a mode of work. 6..... For example, in circumstances like these, it is not so hard for certain members to decide to slack off, which is not what you want your staff to be doing.

In addition, existing tensions can easily be exacerbated in group contexts. Egos will always be a problem whenever people have to work together. 7..... Needless to say, personality clashes of this kind are hardly an issue when working individually.

Finally, decision-making in groups can be something of a time-consuming affair. 8..... However, although the process might be slower, the quality of the final decision or piece of work will hopefully be far greater.
