EUROPEAN EDUCATION OBJECTIVES

Europe 2020 is the European Union's current ten-year growth strategy. Education and Training 2020 is a strategic framework for European cooperation in education and training that builds on its predecessor ET2010. Their combined targets in education are:

Pre-primary

 Raise the proportion of children between 4 years old and the age for starting compulsory primary-education participating in early childhood education to at least 95%.

Secondary

- Reduce school drop-out rates to 10%.
- Reduce the proportion of low-achieving 15-year olds in reading, mathematics and science to less than 15%.

Tertiary

• Raise the proportion of 30-34-year-olds completing third level education to 40%.

Lifelong learning

Raise the average of adults that participate in lifelong learning to at least 15%.

FOCUS ON MIGRANT EDUCATION

Efforts to reach <u>Europe's 2020 targets</u> on education and employment should focus on young people with a migrant background because:



- Immigrant students are over-represented at the lowest educational level: 36% of first generation 15-year olds perform at the lowest levels in mathematics, language and science, whereas the rate for native students is 17% (PISA 2009).
- Young people with a migrant background are twice as likely to drop out of school: In 2012, the overall rate for early school leavers in the EU was 12.7%, while the equivalent rate for third-country nationals was 26.5% (ETM 2013).
- Early school leavers are less likely to find a job and are thus at greater risk of social exclusion: The unemployment rate amongst early school leavers was 40.1% in 2012, against an overall youth unemployment rate of 22.8% (ETM 2013).

WHAT IS SIRIUS?

SIRIUS is a European platform that brings together key stakeholders in migration and education from around Europe, including policy makers, researchers, practitioners and representatives of migrant communities.

SIRIUS transfers knowledge and influences policy developments in order to help pupils from a migrant background achieve the same educational standards as their native peers.

WHAT DOES SIRIUS DO?

- Encourage high-quality, inclusive education for all, with specific measures to improve the support for migrants both inside and outside the school system.
- Mainstream migrant education into education policies so that it becomes a crosscutting issue in national and European migration and education debates.
- Promote better policy implementation that encourages lifelong learning for all disadvantaged pupils.
- Develop European-wide collaboration between stakeholders of all levels.

- Encourages cooperation on policy implementation;
- Develops policy recommendations;

- Develops professional capacity building in schools:
- Encourages teacher diversification;
- Scopes citizenship education across Europe.

3. Involving the community in education
